- Welcome
 - SG described idea for committee as grassroots effort through discussions with Mr. Rubet
 - Questions regarding committee format were addressed
- Introductions- Co-chairs- Angel Rubet & Sandra Gardner

- Explain purpose- Advisory committee, look at issues/concerns that will help to ensure academic success for all students at TH, recommendations are based on consensus and will include pros/cons, recommendations will be passed onto appropriate leaders/decision makers, membership is fluid, with the invitation open to the public to join in at any time
- Explain/Assign roles and responsibilities (recorder- Cybil Howard, timekeeper- Neil Howard, facilitator- Christine Perry), these roles will change each meeting
- Establish group norms and protocols-
 - Norms that are essential to accomplishing our goal...
 - Show respect for all thoughts with kindness
 - Remain open minded
 - One person speaks at a time
 - Use the facilitator to monitor conversation flow
 - Protocols- the way information will be shared, how decisions are made...
 - Welcoming- attendance, continue open meeting notification, encourage new membership, take 5-10 minutes at the beginning of the meeting to review past discussions, post meeting minutes on website
 - Commenting- use written and verbal communication as appropriate to collect information, use round table format first to make sure everyone is heard, raise hands for follow-up discussion, use facilitator to monitor conversation flow, facilitator will change each time
 - Consensus- we work for the good of the order, informative efforts rather than opinionated, make series of recommendations, using pros/cons, at times may need to compromise using the majority vote system- last level
 - Parking lot- use sticky notes to come back to later, these issues will be put on future agendas for discussion, facilitator will assist in monitoring
 - Conflict resolution- pros/cons with no decision
 - Norms reminder- facilitator will gently remind
- Brainstorm issues/topics to address-
 - Establish homework policies with comparable standards*
 - Award recognition for academics
 - Market academics/athletics for college***
 - Focus on academic ECA Clubs (like Model UN)
 - Weighted grades
 - Consistent grading policies
 - Academic good standing policy for extra-curricular activities participation and athletic participation*
 - Share best practices
 - Home/school connection, parent involvement, morals & values, need more supports/resources for parents to help their children***
 - Rigor of coursework, high instructional expectations***
 - Focus on literacy
 - Reaching out to all of our students' needs, engagement of students (special consideration should be given to effects poverty has on cognitive abilities, SES limitations; need for wrap-around services) ***

- Self-esteem programs*
- Collaborate with faculty, build capacity with existing staff*
- Connect to community resources, i.e. careers, internships, life experiences**
